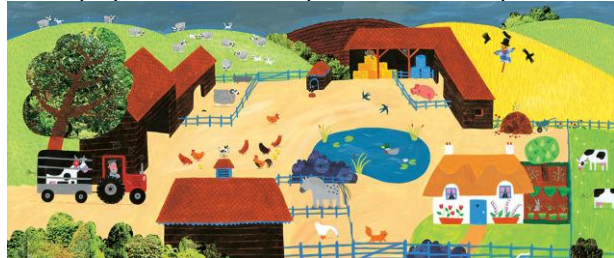

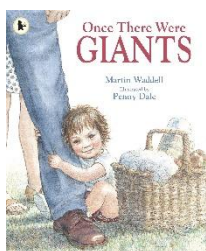
Welcome to the Summer Term!

Children need to come dressed appropriately for forest school with their uniform in a bag. We hope to run all 4 sessions for each class but we will be risk assessing regularly to maintain safety and will notify you if sessions cannot go ahead.

Oral Health

This term we will be taking part in tooth brushing in school with The Big Brush Club. We want to support our children to feel motivated to form healthy habits for life. Nationally, tooth decay is the most common cause of hospitalisation for young children's oral health. In 2022, one in five 3-5 year olds experienced tooth decay.
