Recap discussion yesterday regarding animals and their babies. Read/Watch the story 'Tap! Tap! The Egg Cracked' https://www.youtube.com/wat ch?v=M6yi8PeLGo4&t=10s Do you know any other animals that lay eggs now you have read the story? Together, make a list of which animals laid eggs in the story. You could also watch this video to find out more: https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/p011l380#:~:text=A%20look%20at%20the%20many,lay%20eggs%20on%20a%20branch	Reread the story 'Tap! Tap! The Egg Cracked' again. Now have a go at story mapping the book. Go through each page of the story and write/draw something to represent that part of the story. You could focus on one page/animal at a time. Discuss how the baby animals look different from the adult animals. You can also guess which animal is coming next in the story. Don't forget to join in with the repeated phrase 'Tap! Tap! The egg cracked'.	Listening and understanding: Using the 'Mothers and Their Young' photos, match the adult animal to their baby. Discuss the different names for the baby animals. For example, a baby cow is called a calf whereas a baby pig is called a piglet. Sheep lamb pig piglet goat kid	Create your own collective story: Use this picture to create your own story together: What animal might be inside? What does the animal look like? What happens to the animal at the start of the story? What happens to the animal in the story? How does the story end? Ask your grown-up to write out your story as you tell it. It should be no longer than a side of A5.

Draw a picture of a baby animal of your choice. Now we want you to write about your picture. Don't forget to use your phonics to help you to sound out words. Remember to challenge yourself to use a capital letter, finger spaces and a full stop.
