





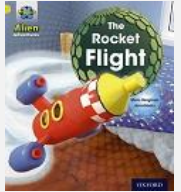

Communication, Language and Literacy	Bank Holiday – School Closed	<p>Listening and understanding:</p> <p>Read/Watch the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar'.</p> <p>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQK-Sm1YY</p> <p>As this will be a familiar story for most children, encourage them to tell you what is going to happen next.</p> <p>Discuss: What is your favourite food that the hungry caterpillar eats? Have you tried any of this food before? Is there any food in the story that you haven't tried before?</p> 	<p>Listening and understanding:</p> <p>Use the resource 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar – Story Cards' to retell the story together as a class.</p> <p>Can the children remember what the hungry caterpillar eats first? What does he eat next? Then what does he eat?</p> <p>You could mix the order of the food up and see if the children can guess which day is in the wrong place.</p>  <p>Don't forget to discuss the days of the week! You can also watch this video here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=zLjlf8c_c</p>	<p>Listening and understanding and understanding the world:</p> <p>Together as a class discuss the life cycle of a butterfly.</p> <p>Recall previous learning about the life cycle of a sunflower. Explain that animals/insects also have life cycles too.</p> <p>On Espresso, read the book 'A butterfly's life cycle'. https://central.espresso.co.uk/espresso/primary_u_k/subject/module/book/item1034645/graded/module1031835/index.html?source=search-all-F-all&source-keywords=life%20cycle%20caterpillar</p> 	<p>Create your own collective story:</p> <p>Create a story together as a class. You could retell the story 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', or you could write a story about a caterpillar/butterfly.</p> <p>Maybe your story could start in a fruit shop/stall.</p> <p>Your story could even be about the biggest caterpillar in the world!</p> <p>Ask your grown-up to write out your story as you tell it. It should be no longer than a side of A5 paper.</p> 






You could use playdough or plasticine; collage materials; junk modelling; pens and pencils etc.</p> 	<p>Understanding the world and Expressive Arts and Design:</p> <p>Eric Carle, the author and illustrator of The Very Hungry Caterpillar, uses collage to create the illustrations in his books. Have a look at some of his other stories. What do you notice about the illustrations?</p> <p>Collage Eric Carle's art is created using the collage technique. He hand paints tissue paper, then cuts and layers them to form bright images.</p>  <p>Can you use collage to create your own minibeast picture in the style of Eric Carle?</p>	<p>Understanding the world:</p> <p>Go on a minibeast hunt outdoors. <p>Continuous provision in the environment</p>	<p>Outdoors: Water, sand, tools for exploring water and sand, potion making, mud kitchen, pirate ship, hut, climbing frame, painting/drawing/mark making, board books, loose parts: crates, planks, tubes, guttering, scrap. Indoors: play dough, writing resources, book corner, calm area, counting resources, construction, small world resources, fine motor resources, art and craft resources, role play – props/costumes</p>				
<p>Opportunities for enhanced provision in the environment</p>	<p>Fruit tasting, mini beast hunt, still life drawing, life cycles of insects, magnifying glasses, leaf cutting, bugs in plastic, painting butterfly, butterfly symmetry painting, repeated patterns, finger printing minibeast, tangrams, making pictures with shapes, modelling with 3d shapes, capital letter formation and matching, lemons and limes in water, fruit on the potions table.</p>
