Play a board game that uses a dice (e.g. snakes and ladders) Practise subitising the dice patterns (recognising the number the pattern represents, without the need to count) Challenge yourself –make your own board game.	Use objects to measure how tall you are (e.g. how many spoons long am I?) Can you find two things that are shorter than you and two things that are taller than you? Challenge yourself - can you estimate how long something might be? Check how accurate you are.
