



1. Introduction and aims

At Paulton Infant School we recognise that mobile phones, including smart phones, are an important part of everyday life for our pupils, parents and staff, as well as the wider school community.

Our policy aims to:

- > Promote, and set an example for, safe and responsible phone use
- > Set clear guidelines for the use of mobile phones for pupils, staff, parents and volunteers
- > Support the school's other policies, especially those related to child protection and behaviour

This policy also aims to address some of the challenges posed by mobile phones in school, such as:

- > Risks to child protection
- > Data protection issues
- > Potential for lesson disruption
- > Risk of theft, loss, or damage
- > Appropriate use of technology in the classroom

2. Roles and responsibilities

2.1 Staff

All staff (including teachers, support staff, and supply staff) are responsible for enforcing this policy.

Volunteers, or anyone else otherwise engaged by the school, must alert a member of staff if they witness, or are aware of, a breach of this policy.

The headteacher is responsible for monitoring the policy every 3 years, reviewing it, and holding staff and pupils accountable for its implementation.

2.2 Governors

The policy is brought to the attention of the LGB every time it needs to be reviewed.

3. Use of mobile phones by staff

3.1 Personal mobile phones

Staff (including volunteers, contractors and anyone else otherwise engaged by the school) are not permitted to make or receive calls, or send texts, while children are present. Use of personal mobile phones must be

restricted to non-contact time, and to areas of the school where pupils are not present (such as the staff room).

There may be circumstances in which it's appropriate for a member of staff to have use of their phone during contact time. For instance:

> For emergency contact by their child, or their child's school

> In the case of acutely ill dependents or family members

The headteacher will decide on a case-by-basis whether to allow for special arrangements.

If special arrangements are not deemed necessary, school staff can use the school office number 01761 40 470 as a point of emergency contact.

3.2 Data protection

Staff must ensure that any personal data, or any other confidential school information processed or accessed on their personal mobile phone remains confidential and that their phone is encrypted so that this data is protected in case of loss or theft of the mobile phone.

3.3 Safeguarding

Staff must refrain from giving their personal contact details to parents or pupils, including connecting through social media and messaging apps. Only staff email addresses, and School Coms can be used to contact parents electronically.

Where staff members are also personal friends of parents, it is acceptable for their contact details to be shared. However, no information relating to staff's professional role should be shared with parents using any platform other than those shared above. Staff must not communicate directly with pupils via their mobile phone under any circumstances, even if those pupils are the children of personal friends.

Staff must avoid publicising their contact details on any social media platform or website, to avoid unwanted contact by parents or pupils.

Staff must not use their mobile phones to take photographs or recordings of pupils, their work, or anything else which could identify a pupil. If it's necessary to take photos or recordings as part of a lesson/school trip/activity, this must be done using school equipment.

3.4 Using personal mobiles for work purposes

In some circumstances, it may be appropriate for staff to use personal mobile phones for work. Such circumstances may include, but aren't limited to:

- > Emergency evacuations
- > Accessing emails or Schools Coms efficiently
- > Supervising off-site trips

In these circumstances, staff will:

- > Use their mobile phones in an appropriate and professional manner, in line with our staff code of conduct
- Not use their phones to take photographs or recordings of pupils, their work, or anything else which could identify a pupil

3.5 Work phones

The school has one mobile phone to be used by the headteacher or other staff delegated to use the phone by the headteacher. This is specifically for work purposes and must not be used for any personal reasons. The primary use for this mobile phone is as a contact number for out of hours safeguarding issues.

Only authorised staff are permitted to use school phones, and access to the phone must not be provided to anyone without authorisation.

Staff must:

- Only use phone functions for work purposes, including making/receiving calls, sending/receiving emails or other communications, or using the internet
- Ensure that communication or conduct linked to the device is appropriate and professional at all times, in line with our staff code of conduct.

3.6 Sanctions

Staff that fail to adhere to this policy may face disciplinary action.

See the school's staff disciplinary policy for more information.

4. Use of mobile phones by pupils

Pupils must not use mobile phones for any reason.

4.1 Sanctions

Any breach of the acceptable use agreement by a pupil may trigger disciplinary action in line with the school behaviour policy, which may result in the confiscation of their device.

Staff have the power to search pupils' phones, as set out in the <u>DfE's guidance on searching, screening and</u> <u>confiscation</u>. The DfE guidance allows staff to search a pupil's phone if they have reason to believe the phone contains pornographic images, or if it is being/has been used to commit an offence or cause personal injury. This will only be done by the Headteacher or a senior member of staff for whom the Headteacher has authorised to carry out the search. In addition, this will be done only with 2 staff members present or one staff member and the child's parent.

Certain types of conduct, bullying or harassment can be classified as criminal conduct. The school takes such conduct extremely seriously, and will involve the police or other agencies as appropriate.

Such conduct includes, but is not limited to:

- > Sexting (consensual and non-consensual sharing nude or semi-nude images or videos)
- > Upskirting
- > Threats of violence or assault
- Abusive calls, emails, social media posts or texts directed at someone on the basis of someone's ethnicity, religious beliefs or sexual orientation

5. Use of mobile phones by parents, volunteers and visitors

Parents, visitors and volunteers (including governors and contractors) must adhere to this policy as it relates to staff if they are on the school site during the school day.

This means:

- Not taking pictures or recordings of pupils, unless it's a public event (such as a school fair), or of their own child
- Using any photographs or recordings for personal use only, and not posting on social media without consent
- > Not using phones in lessons, or when working with pupils

Parents, visitors and volunteers will be informed of the rules for mobile phone use using the slips in Appendix 1 if they are new to the school and will be working with children. The full policy is also available to everyone through the school website.

Parents or volunteers supervising school trips or residential visits must not:

> Use their phone to make contact with other parents

> Take photos or recordings of pupils, their work, or anything else which could identify a pupil

Parents or volunteers supervising trips are also responsible for enforcing the school's policy for pupils using their phones, as set out in section 4 above.

Parents must use the school office as the first point of contact if they need to get in touch with their child during the school day. They must not try to contact their child on his/her personal mobile during the school day.

6. Loss, theft or damage

Confiscated phones will be stored in the school safe.

Lost phones should be returned to the school office or headteacher. The school will then attempt to contact the owner.

7. Monitoring and review

The school is committed to ensuring that this policy has a positive impact of pupils' education, behaviour and welfare. When reviewing the policy, the school will take into account:

- > Feedback from parents and pupils
- > Feedback from teachers
- > Records of behaviour and safeguarding incidents
- > Relevant advice from the Department for Education, the local authority or other relevant organisations

8. Appendix 1: Template mobile phone information slip for visitors

Use of mobile phones in our school

- > Please keep your mobile phone on silent/vibrate while on the school grounds
- Please do not use phones where pupils are present. If you must use your phone, you may go to the staff room
- > Do not take photos or recordings of pupils (unless it is your own child), or staff
- > Do not use your phone in lessons, or when working with pupils

The school accepts no responsibility for phones that are lost, damaged or stolen while you are on the school grounds.
